FROM THE EDITOR

Sometimes some things come to one's attention in such a way as to bring about the need for it to be addressed. When one travels in and out the gate long enough, some things become difficult to go without notice. Therefore, a moment would like to be taken to make a suggestion.

Subject: Gate/Call Box Etiquette

As a driver attempting to enter Callender Lake, please take a moment when you see someone sitting at the callbox. Please pause to see if they have already dialed, are in the midst of dialing, or are conversing with the property owner. If it is apparent they have made contact, it is highly probably the gate will open for them shortly. Please hang back and allow them the access they rightfully acquired.

On the other hand, if you are the property owner who is responding to a callbox call, ask your guest if the gate is clear. If it is not, instruct them to tell you when the gate is clear. When it is clear, instruct your guest to move up to the gate. Count to at least 5, then hit the 9 to open the gate. This allows your guest time to move from the callbox to the gate preventing some less aware, or less considerate driver from stealing your guests' gate.

In the nutshell, please be aware of your surroundings, be courteous of others around you, and remember, we do not live in a vacuum.

WAKE UP CALLENDER LAKE!!!

The time has come for the CLPOIA membership to wake up and look around, not only at your personal property, but the activities on your neighbor's property and public areas around the community. It is time for the membership to become active and help retake our community back from individuals who do not own property and gain access by the use of owner gate cards, the phone call box and/or by tail gating those within our community who do not stop the individuals and get the necessary information to report them. Most just look the other way but are the first ones to complain about seeing someone else tailgating. These illegal entries and the property owners, who allow them access by various other means, are the individuals who do not think any rules pertain to them. They have no concern for the rights of others. Do you know what the following words have in common: Boredom, Calmness, Disinterested, Indifferent, Lackadaisical, Lethargic, Passive, and Unconcerned? The word is **APATHY!** It appears that many in our community, including the author of this article, have become apathetic. We have great Boards, who have and are doing an outstanding job for our gated community, most of which, is accomplished without any help from the membership. Volunteerism is at an all-time low; we just want to sit back and reap the benefits as long as someone else does the work. This seems to be the motto of our country today.

People are being granted access to our community by some of our own membership and once inside, allowed to do as they please, i.e. use our public areas, which are designated for owners and their families, speed up and down our roads without anyone reporting this to the Sheriff's office. Some of our property owners are trying to sell their property because of the alcohol/drug use/excessive foul language at our swimming area, which again is for our owners and their families, not individuals who are not owners. If you are someone who allows your children to go to the swim area alone, you need to start accompanying them until we, as a community, get our act together and regain our community before it is too late. The excess use of alcohol, the smell of marijuana and evidence of other drugs, as well as the loud, boisterous foul language that is present is not appropriate for anyone, much less young children. The language can be heard by families on the Island; imagine what it would be like if you owned property adjacent to the swim area. Disrespect for properties on adjoining lots, such as trespassing is also a major issue. This same unacceptable activity is also becoming a problem on our lake with boats and individuals who do not reside within or own property within our community.

No one seems to want to call the Sheriff because they don't want to get involved. This is your community and you need to get involved to protect your own property rights. If only one person from the Board or Security contacts either the Sheriff's office or the Constable, it does not represent the totality of our problem. It appears as if only "the same one

individual” reports problems. It’s like the old story of the “Boy Who Cried Wolf”. After a period of time, unfortunately the call is not treated with the same response. Callender Lake is not getting the support/response from our VZC Sheriff’s office that we deserve. We need to report all incidents to the Sheriff so they will have a record of our calls. If you see anything unfamiliar or something that just does not seem right to you, call the Sheriff’s office and report it. Keep a record of when you called and the time the Sheriff’s Deputies arrived.

For those of you who don’t already know, our monthly August Board meeting was interrupted by a very rude, aggressive individual who had to be escorted out after the SO was called. The same individual, and others, created a problem at the boat launch area on Saturday afternoon and a very unpleasant situation at the swimming area on Sunday night.

Many want to sit back and blame others for these disturbances, but unfortunately the major blame belongs inside our community because the troublemakers are either some of our own property owners or their guests.

I am a property owner who loves this community and does not want to see property values decline because we are too reluctant to get involved! We need to form Citizens on Patrol, Neighborhood or Crime Watch’s within our community and, assign Block Captains, enough to monitor small sectors throughout our community, until these undesired individuals, including property owners who allow them access and participate in some or most of the unpleasant activities, realize it will no longer be tolerated. We just cannot sit back in the comfort of our homes and hope it goes away. As long as we remain apathetic, we have no one to blame but ourselves. It will not be long until our property values start to decline and valued property owners’ start trying to sell. I want my grandchildren to enjoy the same things that caused me to purchase property at Callender Lake.

I have requested a meeting with the VZ County Judge, the Sheriff, the Constable and the VZC District Attorney. We pay school & property taxes; we have no county roads surrounding our community on which our taxes are applied, so I want to know where our tax money is going. Apparently not enough is going to the Sheriff’s office to even justify one deputy for Precinct 4. That’s just “so wrong” as the commercial states.

I am asking all property owners to reevaluate why you are here and what you like about our community. I think if you evaluate it honestly, you will agree that we have a good life here but as property owners’ we need to do more to help our Board’s and also come together to protect our assets and our community. If nothing else, we might need to consider hiring armed security guards to man the gate and public areas. That of course would probably cost more money than the Association has budgeted. Budgets can be increased but dedicated volunteers would be less expensive. Just my thoughts on the status of our community.

There has undoubtedly been a time when you have needed various services, such as a plumber, an electrician, a tree trimmer, a painter, etc. You have probably even asked a neighbor or friend if they knew someone. We would like to take opportunity to help provide that ever asked question, "Who do I call?" It is sometimes as important to know who not to call, as it is who to call. Board Meeting Minutes

Callender Lake Property Owner Improvement Association

10 August 2013

The CLPOIA Board meeting was convened by President John Bradfield at 1:01 PM in the CLPOIA Community Center. All board members that were present including; President, John Bradfield, Vice President, Bill Faulkner, Treasurer, JoAnn Ishmael, Secretary, Richard Tavern and Directors, Dennis Keith, John Harwood, Eddie Hueston, Don White and Ted Caro. Twenty nine (29) guests attended the meeting.

At 1:10 PM the meeting was disrupted by a guest that was "out of order" and John Bradfield called the meeting into recess. The guest was asked to leave the premises and did so. John Bradfield reconvened the meeting at 1:17 PM.

The invocation was given by Ted Caro who also led the pledge of allegiance.

The agenda was approved as written.

OPENING COMMENTS

President John Bradfield opened the meeting with a few brief welcoming remarks. He thanked those in the audience for attending and noted the above average attendance.

OFFICER'S REPORTS

Secretary's Report Richard Tavern noted that the minutes of the previous (July) meeting had been circulated via email and were found to be correct as written. Then, with no objections, the Board dispensed with the reading of the minutes from the July 2013 meeting. Richard Tavern moved that these minutes be approved and filed for record; the motion was seconded by Eddie Hueston and passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report The Treasurer's Report that is attached to these minutes was reviewed by JoAnn Ishmael and she moved that the report be approved and filed for audit. John Harwood and Ted Caro offered seconds and the motion passed unanimously.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Silting on Upper End of Slater Creek – Dennis Keith reported that the property owners impacted by this silting and the Board are considering the sites available to stage the spoil from the dredging proposed to

test the effectiveness of the process. Dennis stated that the 2013-2014 budget will include a \$30,000 budget line item to move forward project.

Office Remodel – John Harwood reported that the office was closed on July 23 for refurbishment and re-opened on July 30 with the work 95% complete. The balance of the work will be completed over the next two weeks.

NEW BUSINESS

Maintenance Fund Agreements JoAnn Ishmael reported that there were no new Maintenance Fund agreements to consider or approve this month.

Board Election in September – nominations from the floor for persons willing to run for a position as a board member in the upcoming elections were received as follows:

- Larry Giles was nominated by Jay Weisner with a second from Greg Bolle
- Jan Liedtke was nominated by Sue Stephens with a second from Greg Bolle
- Sara Kessler was nominated by Marion Tate with a second from Greg Bolle

All three persons nominated are willing to serve the community in this capacity if elected.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Recreation Committee Ted Caro reported that the Recreation Committee met on August 6 and they discussed a methodology for thanking everyone that serves on committees in the community. John Bradfield delivered the “Thank You” message to all persons serving the community on the various boards. The recreation committee provided the cookies and iced tea that was served at the board meeting today.

Public Area Maintenance Eddie Hueston reported that Doug Ferris continued the summertime maintenance tasks of mowing, trimming, litter removal and operation of the swim area. He also assisted with moving furniture and equipment in office area as part of the renovation project.

Debra Abbuhl repaired irrigation system heads and valves. Canales Tree Service removed three dead trees from the boat trailer storage / tractor barn area and one located next to the keypad just outside the entry gate.

Road Maintenance Bill Faulkner reported that Doug Ferris made repairs of potholes and other small areas with oil sand and gravel. Also we contracted for the repaving of two deteriorated sections of Whippoorwill Drive. The largest section repaved begins at the intersection of Whippoorwill and Bent Tree. The smaller section is near the intersection with Wildflower.

Additionally, we replaced the stop sign at the intersection of Long Shadow and Briar Grove that had been stolen.

Community Center Report No report this month.

Dam Maintenance Report Dennis Keith reported that the excess CMU blocks that remained when the contractor finished the work are considered abandoned and are now the property of the association. We will utilize the materials to fulfill a requirement of the TCEQ report for by using the block as rip rap at the shore line on both sides of the boat ramp to help control erosion.

Architectural Control Committee JoAnn Ismael reported that three building permits were conditionally approved pending additional information form the applicants. One permit was approved unconditionally. The committee also sent the Board proposed language for a classification for a property on which the residence has been demolished. The Board made minor modifications to the proposed language and the classification will be included in the revised Building Permit Application.

Legal Advisory Committee No report this month.

Publicity John Harwood reported that a new lighted outside bulletin board has been ordered and will be installed by the trailer septic dump station when it arrives. This area will also be where the Lake Lines will be placed for distribution/pick-up by residents.

Audit No report this month. Eddie Hueston reported that Ronnie Liedtke has volunteered to chair the audit committee and that Gerald Kessler will join the committee. Eddie also reported that Ada Walker, who announced her resignation in May has agreed to assist with the Audit for the second half of 2013. The balance of the committee will remain the same.

Security and Fire John Bradfield reported that issues regarding visitors (non-residents) using the swim area and trespassing on resident's docks has escalated this summer. Many of these visitors have no respect for the posted lake rules, state boating regulations or for personal property. The board agreed to pay for private security patrols for the swimming area and boat launch area for each weekend until the swimming area is closed for the season.

John also reported that under the new Sheriff we have fewer visits from Deputies and in general it seems that support for our community by the newly elected Sheriff has diminished. He has repeatedly asked to meet with the Sheriff and cannot get an audience.

Fish and Wildlife No report this month.

Sanitation and Pollution Don White reported that the new contact with Allied Waste was executed and resulted in annual savings of \$3,000-\$4,000 per year. The large roll-off dumpster is scheduled for September 13, 14 and 15.

Restrictions No report this month. This committee has been officially disbanded until there are additional restrictions to consider.

OTHER REPORTS

CA Cockrell was in attendance and gave his update regarding the Council of Van Zandt County Communities (CVZCC), Greater Lake Palestine Council (GLPC), Texas Neighborhoods Together or Texans Against Monopolies Excess Rates (TAMER) is included below:

Ted Caro moved that the meeting be adjourned at 2:07 PM. The motion was seconded by Dennis Keith and the motion passed unanimously.

CLPOIA MONTHLY Board Report

August 13, 2013

Council of Van Zandt County Communities (CVZCC)- The August meeting will be conducted on Tuesday, August 13, 2013 at the VZ Country Club. The guest speaker will be Senator Bob Deuell.

Texas Neighborhoods Together (TNT)- Meeting today in Garland. An HOA/POA "Boot Camp" seminar is being conducted in conjunction with the bi-monthly meeting.

GLPC-The next Board meeting will be held on August 22, 2013 at "The Meadows" in Frankston. The next General membership meeting will be September 21, 2013 at Sunrise Shores on Lake Palestine. This will be a combination General Membership meeting and the Annual Bar-B-Q. Invited guests will include elected representatives of the State Legislators who supported, and made it happen for TAMER on the Water Rate Case Transfer of Authority. Cost of the Bar-B-Q meal will be \$8.00 per person. If anyone is interested in attending, please let me know no later than our next CLPOIA Board meeting which is September 14th.

TAMER- A conference call, lasting 1:15, was conducted on July 24, 2013 between TAMER Board members and attorney David Fredrick's office. David discussed the rule making process for transferring the rate making authority from TCEQ to the PUC. At this time Chapter 291 of the Texas Administrative Code (TAC) currently defines the guidelines for TCEQ. An interim transition committee has been assigned to establish the new laws and write a Memorandum of Agreement or Understanding (MOA/MOU) transferring the rate making authority from TCEQ to the Public Utility Commission (PUC). Michelle Gregg will represent TCEQ and Todd Gallagher will represent PUC. At this time no one has been identified to represent the Office of Public Utilities Counsel (OPUC) who is currently drafting proposed regulations for the transition. OPUC is the legal group within the PUC. It was determined that some TAMER Board members should be participants in this transition and should initiate visits to both Michelle Gregg & Todd Gallagher within the next 2-3 weeks. David asked for approximately 4 volunteers to form this TAMER transition team. Thomas Fritsinger from the Austin area, Bill Hudgins from the Houston area, Jeff Lindley from the Trinidad (Cedar Creek) area and C. A. Cockrell from the Callender Lake/Lake Palestine area) volunteered. The plan is for each volunteer to travel to Austin and personally introduce ourselves, and the TAMER Organizations Goals & Objectives to the PUC/TCEQ Transition Committee. David is to be notified when we make the trip and could possibly accompany the TAMER volunteer on the visit. It is imperative that we are part of the ongoing discussions and have input to the rules and procedures that become reality for the future rate making decisions.

David indicated that he was expecting a new rate case to be initiated by Monarch/SWWC on or about November 2013. A general discussion of the potential size of the rate increase


and the options available to Monarch were discussed. David indicated that he did not believe this rate case, whenever it occurs, should be settled by mutual agreement but that it should be a legal judgment by the Court. He estimates the legal costs to be in the area of \$75,000.00. This brought up the subject of TAMER's financial status and the fact that we were currently indebted to him from our latest legislative activities for approximately \$9,000.00 at this time. A discussion of "How To Get More Contributions" was discussed. Suggestions were to develop a power point presentation and for various TAMER members to get out to more HOA/POA's and brief all the rate payers on what TAMER has been successful in accomplishing and what the major issues we will be facing in the future.

David also suggested that TAMER provide some type of "thank you" to all the legislators that helped us get the bills through the legislature that resulted in our victory getting the rate making authority transferred from TCEQ to the PUC. Jim Pitts, Lance Gooden, Robert Nichols, Bob Deuell, Dan Flynn, Charlie Geren, and Keven Eltiffe were some of the names mentioned. It was agreed that letters would be written on TAMER letterhead and mailed. Two type letters would be signed, one by TAMER Board members and the others with signatures of TAMER rate payers within each legislators districts.

If anyone in our community has any suggestions and/or recommendations on how to better communicate with our rate payers or new ideas for soliciting donations, please let Jay Wiesner or I know. Once again for all those who have donated to help us get this far, Jay & I thank you from the bottom of our hearts. To those, in our community who have contributed nothing, please consider making a donation for this final drive to the finish line. Any amount would be extremely helpful.
